



Professor Khadiagala is one of the world's leading experts on Africa risk and African geopolitics. He is a trained and seasoned political scientist with over 25 years of teaching and research in Kenya, Canada, the United States, and South Africa. After completing his undergraduate at the University of Nairobi in 1980, Khadiagala studied at McMaster University in Ontario, Canada, where he wrote his MA dissertation on Chinese Foreign Policy in the 1970s. His PhD was obtained at the School of Advanced International Studies (SAIS), Johns Hopkins University, Washington DC, where he wrote on the Frontline States in Southern African Security. Professor Khadiagala has lectured on topics related to political economy and African security at Johns Hopkins in the United States and was appointed as the Jan Smuts Professor of International Relations at the University of the Witwatersrand. Professor Khadiagala has lectured numerous courses, the few favourites being Protest and Revolt; Corruption in Comparative Perspectives; Comparative Studies in Politics and Society; African International Relations; and African Political Thought. Since his publication of his PhD dissertation in 1994, he has published 10 books and monographs, over 45 major book chapters and 35 journal articles.
